With the start of the new school year, it's a good time to make sure your PPS Volunteer Background Check <u>here</u> is current. Volunteer registration and background check are required before you can volunteer. Volunteer registrations are good for 3 years.

REMINDER

To help keep classroom disruption minimal, please have your student double check that they have everything they need for the day before leaving for school. Consider making a checklist and hanging it by the door to check before leaving (this allows your child to start building independence). Things to include on the checklist would be water bottle, chromebook (3-5 students), homework, lunch, jacket, glasses, etc.

STUDENT HEALTH CENTER

REMINDER Franklin High School has a Student Health Center that is available to all K-12 PPS students. Student Health Centers are like having a doctor's office at school. Students can get regular or sports physicals, school immunizations, mental health services, COVID-19 vaccinations and testing, prescription medication refills, and lots of other health services. There are no out-of-pocket costs. The following links describe how students can access their closest <u>MCHD Student Health Center</u> and the <u>Benson Wellness Center at Marshall</u>.

COVID-19 Testing Options for the 23-24 School Year

PPS will continue to offer free COVID-19 testing options to students in partnership with the Oregon Health Authority <u>COVID-19 Testing in Oregon's K-12 Schools Program</u>:

- **Onsite Diagnostic (symptom-based) Testing** for staff and students who develop symptoms onsite. Please complete and return a signed 2023-24 Parent/Guardian <u>consent form</u> to the school if you want your student to receive onsite testing if indicated.
- iHealth/ BinaxNOW (at-home) Tests: Students may receive a rapid COVID-19 test for at home use if they develop symptoms consistent with COVID-19 or if they have been exposed to COVID-19 outbreak at school and families request one. OHA has made a limited number of tests available to our school. Test users can check the lot expiration date using the <u>iHealth COVID-19 Test Shelf Life Extension Sheet</u> or look up the new expiration date for iHealth tests <u>here</u>.
- School-Community COVID-19 Testing Resources: The <u>MCHD Student Health</u> <u>Centers</u> and the <u>OHSU Benson Wellness Center</u> are also great resources for students to access primary and mental health care as well as COVID-19 testing, vaccines and boosters.

The **OHSU Weekly Screening Program** that collected student saliva samples to be tested ended as of July 31, 2023.

FREE/REDUCED PRICE MEAL BENEFITS

If students are enrolled in a non-CEP school, families must reapply for free/reduced price meal benefits for the new school year. Eligibility from last year will carry over only until Oct 10th; if a new application is not received, the free/reduced benefits will end and students would need to pay for their meals. Did you know? In Oregon, a family of 4 may be eligible if they make \$90,000 gross per year or less? Free-Reduced Flyer
