FREE/REDUCED ELIGIBILITY - 30 DAY CARRY OVER ENDING OCT 10

PPS families who qualified for free and reduced-priced meals last school year (2022-23) have 30 days at the start of the school year to re-apply without incurring meal charges. If complete meal applications for eligible households are not approved by October 10th, meal charges will
